Grow strategically

- Increased enrolment by 18%
- Created 20 new academic programs
- Built/transformed six signature spaces
- · Welcomed hundreds of Brescia students, faculty and staff

Stimulate research, scholarship and creative activity

- Increased annual research funding by 19.4% to \$315M
- Added 49 new research chairs (CERC, CRCs and endowed chairs)
- Engaged 1,000 members in interdisciplinary innovation through four signature research institutes
- Honoured 23 Scholars as Fellows of the Royal Society of Canada
- Increased the number of postdoctoral scholars by 14.6%



Promote teaching and learning for the future

- Introduced Generative AI Teaching Fellows and AI Teaching Community of Practice
- Implemented Brightspace online learning platform (12,000+ courses, 40,000+ learners)
- Created student-driven Quality Assurance Academy
- Transformed 98 academic spaces with advanced classroom technologies

- Increased experiential learning participation from 74% to 90%
- Redesigned Western Launch transition program
- Created a Certificate in Entrepreneurship available to students from all faculties
- Introduced a graduate life website and graduate life coaching
- Engaged 1,650 students in Undergraduate Summer Research Internships

Advance Reconciliation

- Opened Wampum Learning Lodge as a hub for Indigenous-led learning and community engagement
- Developed Maatookiiying gaa-miinigoowiziying (Sharing our Gifts) Indigenous Learning Bundles
- Created guides on Indigenous allyship and centring Indigenous voices in research
- Continued work to decolonize and Indigenize undergraduate and graduate education



A more equitable and inclusive Western

- Established the Office of Equity, Diversity & Inclusion and Office of Indigenous Initiatives
- Launched Advancing Inclusive Excellence EDIDA strategic plan
- Expanded scholarships and bursaries for equitydeserving groups to \$2.46M per year
- Created new admissions pathways for Black students in Law, Ivey, Schulich, and Education
- Developed 12 e-learning modules on racism and oppression (55,500+ completions)
- Introduced Guidance on Inclusive Excellence in Graduate Education



Thriving through belonging

- Funded 23 projects through the Parr Centre for Thriving
- Hosted 40+ annual events to support and recognize equity-deserving groups
- Held five staff and leader learning days to strengthen connection and belonging
- Increased alumni engagement by 42% since 2021/22

Concentrate on place

- Built stronger relationships with London and region
- Developed Western's Toronto Space (opening in 2026)
- Enabled 5,000 students annually to complete projectbased learning with local organizations
- Hosted two Engage Western events raising a total of \$50,000+ for local charities



Engage the world

- Launched Western in the World global engagement plan
- Deepened international partnerships and expanded international agreements to 267 in 60 countries
- Supported students to participate in international mobility activities in 79 countries (2021/22-2023/24)
- Welcomed 687 visiting research students from 57 countries
- Increased international media coverage by 61.54% over the past three years



Sustainability, an imperative

- Reduced greenhouse gas emissions by 34% (over 2005 baseline) while campus grew by 39%
- Ranked 14th globally and 3rd in Canada for sustainable development
- Achieved Gold STARS rating, meeting new, rigorous global standards for sustainability in higher education
- Offered 2,700+ courses and engaged in 1,900+ research initiatives aligned with Sustainable Development Goals
- Preparing to launch a new Climate and Sustainability Strategy in 2026
